In the past 20 years the camp has changed locations four times, added a boys week, and changed directors and leadership organization.

As we continue to improve camp operations and administration, change will continue as well. Thank you for your faithful prayer support which helps us adapt to new things.

At a recent meeting the LoLCC Board approved the move to Policy Governance. The official transition will take place January 1, 2011, however the process began in early October.

It is the *function* of

the board which will change from dealing with the operations of camp to setting policies which set the direction of the ministry. John Carver has written a book on the Policy Governance Model. If you wish to know more about this model, please go to this website: www.carvergovernance.com/model.htm.

Policy Governance calls for an Executive Director (ED) who is directly responsible to the board. The ED then selects and administers all other camp personnel. The ED is an ex-officio member of the board; however, administrators and directors

will no longer serve on the board.

Charmaine Freeze will be leaving the leadership of the board to assume the leadership of the camp as the Executive Director. Jane Fenby from Land o' Sunshine Camp Cedarbrook in Florida, who has been serving as our Board Chair for the past year, will continue in that role during 2011 in order to help us through the transition.

We would appreciate your prayers as we work through the changes and as we seek to serve the Lord more effectively in the year ahead.

Since moving from a job in the secular world to a job with a non-profit organization, I have changed the way I look at giving. I previously thought that if I could not give a significant amount of money, then it wasn't worth giving. And, because I was afraid I wouldn't be able to give a large amount consistently, I didn't give.

I have seen how God has multiplied small gifts into full support of a missionary or even to help an organization to meet their budget.

Do you realize that if only three people gave \$10 per month, one more child could come to camp? Or if one person gave \$20 per month, our expenses for an all-camp cookout will be covered. If 10 people give \$30 per month, it will cover the cost of our Morning Watch and Bible Exploration curriculum.

LoLCC is also listed on-line with GoodSearch, which means you can support camp without costing you anything. Go to www.goodsearch.com and set it as your default home page. Every search you make earns LoLCC one cent. When you shop through GoodSearch, even more money goes to LoLCC.

This last year we earned \$53.00 through searches! That's 5,300 searches that made a difference! Shopping brought in another \$21.10

for a total of \$74.10. Since we began using GoodSearch we've received \$242.95! Will you help make 2011 the best year yet?

Although LoLCC needs financial supporters to keep camp running, we also know that prayer support is what keeps camp effective. Please put us on your prayer list and pray for the staff, board, and campers. Pray for the spiritual life of the leadership—to keep camp true to the Word of God and to please Him in all that is said and done.
